

It wasn't my turn to eat dinner *

Single female householder with children under age 18 2010 Census








Very low food security is multiple indications of disrupted eating patterns and reduced food intake. **Low food security** is reduced quality, variety, or desirability of diet with little or no reduced food intake.

52,011 Monterey County children received school meals in 2014, but only 6,741 received meals during the summer – potentially leaving

Eligible Monterey County residents participating in CalFresh nutrition assistance program









- Can be expedited in 3 days for migrant or seasonal farm workers
- Does not affect other benefits
- Can be renewed/re-applied
- Is not reported to any other government agency
- Undocumented parents can apply for their children who have legal status
